
Bedona, Moab pril 18th -

We'll fly into Phoenix where our coach will meet us... relax and enjoy the scenery as we wind our way through desert plateaus to beautiful Sedona, Arizona,



Today were off for a **Pink Jeep Tour**; they provide the most talked about off-road adventures in the Southwest! We will take their **ultimate scenic tour!** Travel up the Mogollon Rim along Bear Wallow Canyon to Merry Go Round rock. The historic "Munds Trail" is now a rocky, bumpy forest road (Schnebly Hill Road) but it was once a wagon trail that connected Sedona with Flagstaff. The views along Schnebly Hill Road are spectacular as you look down on the town of Sedona and see the entire Verde Valley spilling into the horizon. Your afternoon is free to explore on your own... Sedona is full of shops, galleries, and eateries. Enjoy! We'll meet this evening for a great dinner at a local favorite.

First stop today is Meteor Crater. It is the breath-taking result of a collision between an asteroid traveling 26,000 miles per hour and planet Earth approximately 50,000 years ago. Meteor Crater is nearly one mile across, 2.4 miles in circumference and more than 550 feet deep. We're off for Goulding's Trading Post, lodge, and museum today... It's located just north of the Arizona-Utah border, adjacent to the Navajo Tribal Park in Monument Valley. Harry Goulding introduced director John Ford to Monument Valley where he shot several of his westerns. It is on the National Register of Historic Places! We'll check into the lodge before indulging in a great cook out under the stars! The next morning, we tour the famous monoliths of Monument Valley. After a Navajo Rug Weaving Demonstration, photo stops will be made at The Mittens, John Ford's Point, Three Sisters, North Window, Totem Pole, Yei Bi Cheis, and Artist's Point. We'll continue northeast to our home for the next 2 nights; The Fairfield Inn... Nestled between the picturesque red rock cliffs, and the Colorado River. We are two miles from Arches National Park, and 30 minutes from Dead Horse Point and Canyonlands National Park.

We'll have a tour of a lifetime as we drive through Arches National Park, a red rock wonderland containing some of the most scenic and inspiring landscapes on Earth. In addition to over 2,000 arches, the park also contains a variety of other geological formations, such as colossal sandstone fins, & massive balanced rocks. Then it's spectacular Dead Horse Point State Park, and the Island in the Sky district of Canyonlands National Park. The mesa provides breathtaking views of south-eastern Utah and the pinnacles and buttes of Canyonlands National Park. Stroll along the Rim Walk, towering 2,000 feet directly above the Colorado River! You're in for a real treat tonight, as we head to Canyonlands By Night for a Dutch Oven Dinner. Then we'll load onto their flat bottom boat and head up the Colorado River, where the guide will point out interesting sites, as they light up the canyon with 40,000 watts! This is one of the most unique light shows in the country, and a great end to our day!

The next morning we'll head to the Salt Lake Airport with cherished memories...
