Jackson Hole, The Tetons & Park City!

August 7th – 13th, 2022

Jackson (originally called Jackson's Hole by mountain men) is in a valley between the Gros Ventre and Teton mountain ranges. Unlike most mountain ranges the Tetons lack foothills, which can obscure the view. As such, the Tetons rise sharply from 5,000 to nearly 7,000 feet above the surrounding terrain. The Park is famous throughout America for its spectacular landscape featuring majestic mountains, pristine lakes, and abundant wildlife. Park City... Known for the 2002 Winter Olympics, this beautiful town is full of charm and history!

We'll fly into Jackson this afternoon where we'll make our way to our home for the next 5 nights **The Elk Country Inn...** located just steps away from the famous Town Square. You'll have a little time to freshen up before we head to **dinner at the Gun Barrel Steak & Game House...** named after the small east Texas town of Gun Barrel City. It was originally a Wildlife Museum & Taxidermy. Enjoy the atmosphere & some great food.

After breakfast we take a scenic **float trip on the Snake River...** this peaceful trip is one of the best places to see the Tetons and is a bird watcher's paradise. Our guides will enlighten us on the serene, yet powerful Snake River. We'll indulge in a **delicious lunch at Dorman's** located on the bank of the Snake before we head back to town. Next, it's the **Bar T 5 Chuck Wagon Dinner...** Travel by horse drawn covered wagons into beautiful Cache Creek Canyon. As we pull into camp you will smell the sweet aroma of a **Dutch oven dinner.** Next, the Bar T 5 Band takes the stage... experience great hand-clapping music & more!

We'll start our day at the **National Wildlife Art Museum...** The Museum's permanent collection of over 5,000 paintings and sculpture by over 100 distinguished artists ranging from early American Tribes through contemporary masters. Next, we will take a scenic driving tour through **Grand Teton National Park...** We'll make a few stops along the way including **Mormon Row Historic District...** James and Ann May migrated from Idaho over Teton Pass into Jackson Hole, to claimed 160 acres under the Homestead Act of 1862. Next, the **Chapel of the Transfiguration...** this log chapel was built to frame a Cathedral Group of peaks in a large window behind the altar.

We'll start the today with a **scenic cruise on Jenny Lake.** Learn about the history and geology of the area as well as the flora and fauna around the lake. The photo opportunities on the cruise are second to none! We'll stop for **lunch at the Jackson Lake Lodge** before we make our way back to town **where your evening is free to explore.**

After breakfast we'll head to Teton Village Resort for a **Gondola Ride.** The tram will take us from the valley floor to the mountain summits rising 4,139 feet. Tonight, **it's the Historic Jackson Hole Playhouse...** they will bring us a full evening of Western entertainment, from gun-slinging, singing waiters to fully-staged musical comedies.

We'll head for **Park City** this morning... we'll make a few stops along the way including **the Patterson Visitors Center...** it was once known as the Oil House. **Welcome to Park City** It is famous for the 2002 Winter Olympics. It was originally famous for its Silver Mining... The town's residents enjoyed great prosperity for half a century!

This morning we'll make our way to the Salt Lake airport and home with new friends, memories of fun adventures and more **in two of the West's favorite towns... Jackson Hole Wyoming and Park City Utah!**
