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Day 1 – Monday, Sept. 28: Welcome to Salt Lake City

Our Utah adventure begins with a late-morning flight from Portland to Salt Lake City, where our motorcoach will be waiting. After arriving mid-afternoon, we will settle into our downtown hotel. This evening, we gather for a welcome dinner in downtown Salt Lake City to catch up with friends both new and old. After dinner, we will pass by some of Salt Lake City's notable landmarks as we return to the hotel for a relaxing evening and a good night's rest as our fall journey begins. (D)

Day 2 – Tuesday, Sept. 29: Utah's Capitol & Natural History

After breakfast, we begin our day at the beautiful Utah State Capitol, where we will learn about the state's history, government, and early settlement while enjoying sweeping views over the city. We then head toward the University of Utah area for lunch before visiting the acclaimed Natural History Museum of Utah. This outstanding museum brings the region's geology, wildlife, and cultural history to life through engaging exhibits. Later this afternoon, we will enjoy a short stop at the International Peace Gardens before returning to the hotel to relax. Dinner this evening is within walking distance of our hotel in downtown Salt Lake City. (B, L, D)

Day 3 – Wednesday, Sept. 30: Sundance & Scenic Fall Color Drive

Today we travel into the Wasatch Mountains to beautiful Sundance Resort. Here we will enjoy a scenic chairlift ride for panoramic views of alpine forests and autumn color. After time to explore and have lunch at your leisure, we return to Salt Lake City via scenic Provo Canyon, known for its waterfalls and golden aspens. We will make a stop at Bridal Veil Falls before heading back to the hotel. Dinner is included this evening in downtown Salt Lake City. (B, D)

Day 4 – Thursday, Oct. 1: Park City & Guardsman Pass

This morning we travel to Park City, host of the 2002 Winter Olympics. We will visit Utah Olympic Park before continuing to historic Main Street for free time to browse galleries, shops, and cafés. After lunch on your own, we enjoy a spectacular fall-color drive over Guardsman Pass, one of

Utah's most scenic mountain routes. We return to Salt Lake City late afternoon for time to rest before dinner together this evening. (B, D)

Day 5 – Friday, Oct. 2: Bryce Canyon National Park

After breakfast we depart Salt Lake City and begin our journey south into Utah's canyon country. We will stop in Fillmore to visit the Territorial Statehouse Museum and enjoy lunch before continuing toward Bryce Canyon. By mid-afternoon we arrive at our hotel near the park. Later, we enter Bryce Canyon National Park to explore its remarkable hoodoo formations and sweeping viewpoints, especially beautiful in the late-day light. After dinner, it will be time to do some guided stargazing under Bryce's famously dark skies. (B, L, D)

Day 6 – Saturday, Oct. 3: Cedar Breaks & Zion Gateway

This morning we travel to Cedar Breaks National Monument, perched more than 10,000 feet above sea level. From scenic overlooks, we will enjoy expansive views of the colorful amphitheater and surrounding high-country landscapes. After lunch, we continue south toward Springdale, the gateway town to Zion National Park. We will check into our hotel and enjoy a relaxed evening together with dinner in town. (B, L, D)

Day 7 – Sunday, Oct. 4: Zion National Park & Journey Home

Our final morning begins with breakfast before we head into Zion National Park. We will board the park shuttle for a scenic ride through Zion Canyon, where towering cliffs and dramatic rock formations create one of the most iconic landscapes in the American Southwest. After time to enjoy the views and have lunch on your own, we depart for Las Vegas. We will arrive at the airport mid-afternoon for our flight home to Portland, filled with memories of Utah's mountains, history, and breathtaking national parks. (B)
