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San Miguel de Allende Cultural Tour

8 Days / 7 Nights January 26 — February 2, 2027

Experience the beauty of San Miguel de Allende and Guanajuato on this 8-day cultural tour featuring historic sites, artisan markets, vineyard tastings, and immersive local experiences.

Day 1 – Tuesday, Jan. 26: Welcome to San Miguel de Allende

Fly from PDX to Querétaro, where your local guide escorts you to San Miguel de Allende. The city announces itself gradually: first the open rangeland of the Bajío, then the terracotta rooftops and then, as you descend into town, the impossible pink towers of the Parroquia rising above everything else. Check in to Hotel Real de Minas and gather this evening for a festive welcome dinner. (D)

Day 2 – Wednesday, Jan. 27: The Story of San Miguel

After breakfast, a guided walking tour of the historic center begins at the iconic Parroquia de San Miguel Arcángel and the Casa de Allende museum, weaving together colonial architecture, indigenous heritage, and revolutionary history. Lunch is at The Restaurant, one of the city's most respected dining rooms. The historic story of San Miguel de Allende continues over dinner at the hotel, transforming the beautiful sights into something genuinely memorable. (B, L, D)

Day 3 – Thursday, Jan. 28: Art, Markets, and Rooftop

Evenings San Miguel de Allende has long attracted artists; the day begins at Fábrica La Aurora, a former textile mill that has been reimaged as one of Mexico's most celebrated art and design centers. Its soaring industrial spaces house galleries, working artist studios, antique dealers, and design showrooms. From there, tour through Mercado Ignacio Ramírez, a traditional covered market, for a vivid introduction to the flavors of the Bajío. The afternoon is yours: time to rest, explore independently. Pre-dinner cocktails at Tunki Rooftop offer panoramic city views; dinner follows at Moxi Restaurant at Hotel Matilda, one of San Miguel's finest tables. (B, D)

Day 4 – Friday, Jan. 29: Sacred Countryside & Organic Ranch

Experience Today venture beyond the city into the remarkable landscape of the Bajío countryside — a place of rolling hills, ancient sanctuaries, and working farms. Visit Santuario de Atotonilco, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that has been called the Sistine Chapel of Mexico for the extraordinary murals that cover its walls, ceilings, and domes from floor to nave. Continue to Rancho Vía Orgánica, a working organic farm and educational center. A guided walk through the farm introduces you to the land and the philosophy behind it; lunch is taken together where the ingredients on your plate were grown steps away. Return to the hotel for rest before the evening's dinner at Mama Mia, where a lively courtyard and the sound of live music create the sort of atmosphere that San Miguel does best. (B, L, D)

Day 5 – Saturday, Jan. 30: Guanajuato: Color & History

This morning travel to the dramatically beautiful UNESCO city of Guanajuato. Built into a narrow canyon and threaded with an underground network of tunnels originally designed to carry floodwater. Visit Teatro Juárez, one of Mexico's great 19th-century theaters, then the Alhóndiga de Granaditas, the site of one of the Mexican War of Independence's defining moments, now a museum which illuminates the struggle that gave modern Mexico its shape. Time at leisure in the centro follows before the group gathers for lunch. The afternoon returns the group to San Miguel, with time to rest and prepare for dinner at La Posadita, a rooftop restaurant where the Parroquia's towers glow across the evening skyline and the city spreads out below. (B, L, D)

Day 6 – Sunday, Jan. 31: Queretaro & Wine Country Today visit a third UNESCO World Heritage city, Querétaro, the beautifully preserved colonial capital that played a decisive role in both Mexican Independence and the fate of Emperor Maximilian. Visit colonnaded plazas, the soaring 300 year old aqueduct, and into the layers of history that make Querétaro one of the most intellectually engaging cities in Mexico. Time at leisure in the centro follows, with lunch on your own at one of the square's many excellent restaurants. The afternoon visit a vineyard in one of Mexico's most exciting wine regions before returning to the hotel. The evening is yours to spend as you choose — time to explore independently, find a café, or sit in the Jardín and watch the city go about its evening. (B)

Day 7 – Monday, Feb. 1: Botanical Garden This morning visit El Charco del Ingenio Botanical Garden, which is perched on a dramatic ravine at the edge of the city. The garden is home one of Mexico's finest collections of native cacti and succulents — more than 1,500 plant species. A guided tour through the garden is a genuinely different kind of experience from the colonial streets and grand buildings of the preceding days, and the views back toward the city from the garden's higher paths are among the most beautiful in San Miguel. The rest of the day is free until a refined farewell dinner. (B, D)

Day 8 – Tuesday, Feb. 2: Departure A final breakfast at the hotel, then a private transfer to Querétaro International Airport for your afternoon flight home. Arrive Portland International Airport in the evening—welcome home from a wonderful journey. (B)
